

Now . . . it was Florida's turn. Joan and I made our way to the podium and when we announced that the remaining 12 were to also

receive laptops it was awesome. Obviously the 12 were elated, but it was the reaction of the kids that already had their computers that was inspiring. They were so happy for their friends and everyone was smiling and there was just so much hugging going on. From the ones that had been at Mooseheart in diapers, to the ones that had only been there one year, each and every one was beaming!

## Weathering the Summer Downpours

## Essentials for riding in the rain.

## **Summer Showers**

Florida Moose Riders, summer is here and so is the rain. Your ride is going to be

challenged by sudden downpours and wet pavement.

Riders do have the advantage of a superior view of the road and maneuverability, but the playing field changes as soon the first drop of rain hits the road. A review of some basic techniques and skills should help you avoid potentially dangerous situations this year.

#### **Smooth Moves**

First things first, be SMOOTH. You don't have the luxury of 4 tires gripping the road, just two tires between you and pavement, so this is not the time to try something stupid. And no matter how good your tires are, accessing that capability requires smooth control inputs to gradually load the tire in order to avoid blasting through the rain shrunk traction range. Be gentle with your brakes and throttle, but balance your grip. When you're riding in the rain, aim to complete your turns before you accelerate.

#### **Traction Action**

Allow yourself to sense tire traction by applying smooth but firm control. Don't, however, be too timid. With practice you will learn to turn or brake smoothly and find that

a surprising amount of maximum braking or steering deflection is available. Remember, too, that sudden stops in the rain require maximum concentration and practice. Wet discs and pads result in a "lag" time that can catch you off guard.

#### Slick Surfaces

Keep your eyes on the road for problem surfaces such as painted ones, tar strips, smooth pavement and metal (manholes, grates, tracks, etc.). These can get pretty slippery in the rain. Avoid puddles as they can hide potholes and slick surfaces. Of course, you need to look out for patches of fluids leaking from automobiles, often in the center of the road or at intersections, ramps, etc.

#### **The Road Ahead**

Pay particular attention to traffic ahead to avoid the need for sudden stops or turns, something you should do no matter what the weather. Keep extra room between you and other vehicles. And remember that in the rain visibility (yours and others) is severely reduced, so be aware of potential problems ahead. Summer in Florida means more tourists who don't know where they are going and with school out more inexperienced drivers on the road. Anticipate or assume someone will pull out in front of you and ride accordingly.

#### **Dress to be Seen**

Finally, make sure you are seen. Run with your high beam and buy that brightly colored rain suit instead of the cool one you had your eye on—or at least get one with bright reflective markings so that you are seen. You will enhance your visibility to other drivers, which is important because other drivers are concentrating on their driving and not on you. Bottom line, your safety is down to you. Ride wisely and be safe this summer.







## **Support for Our Rallies**




## -July 2009 Featured Rider Liz String - New Jersey

## Living Life to the Fullest—and Then Some . . .

We met up with Liz at the Blessing of the Bikes and were surprised to hear that she rode solo from New Jersey to Mooseheart on her 2003 1800cc, Gold Wing. She will be the ripe young age of 60 this July and isn't about to slow down. We asked Liz to tell us about herself. Here's her story.









Liz String, Atlantic City, NJ - Moose Rider, Past Sr. Regent

I don't believe in putting off life. I live it to the fullest (putting a good 10,000 miles on my bike every year). I have no time for the bull, so I either fix it, or forget it. I believe in life: that You find what You are looking for! I am DD in WITW Shore Riders Chapter for over 5 years; where we take Sisters who are new riders under our wings, and try to guide and protect them. I am also an officer for Motorcycle Rights Association of NJ for over 5 years, and I have organized between 10-30 bikes for the past 7 years in the Atlantic City St. Patrick's Parade. I am proud to be a part of the MRA Safety campaign, and I also work full time as a dealer at Harrahs, since 1980-but I demand my play time!

I have ridden with the POLAR BEARS and, in fact, I ride all winter long--200-300 miles every Sunday @ 20 degree temperatures, November to April in NJ. These rides are not for wimps, but the elderly like Leo who is 92 and Gloria who is 85 are always welcome. I'm looking forward to doing motor crew for a 2 day Cancer Walk on Oct 9 & 10, I'm an avid kayaker, and last but not least, once a

year I do a 45 mile bicycle tour of New York City—the only time I'm on two wheels without a motor!

My husband Raymond does not ride, but totally supports my little trips, and he is thankful that I have lots of riding buddies. I consider him the "Angel in my pocket", as he always comments when I return from a ride, "I prayed for you." He encourages me to live my life in my way, as he does his! 


