Newly formed districts 15 (Pensacola) and 25 (Cape Coral) were present as were riders from Districts 19, 20, and 23.

After a brief break, the Board and District Chairmen gathered for the scheduled meeting. DelCorso and Myers were in attendance and were able to answer questions and provide guidance. Both praised the Moose Riders and complimented us on the work we have done and confirmed that "we are doing it right". Topics covered in the meeting included the upcoming rally at Mandarin 42, International Children's Day on May 15, fundraising reporting procedures, State logo usage, donations for the Mooseheart Seniors' computer fund, and Committee Chairmen appointments. DelCorso observed that Moose Riders are doing a good job and that we don't know how good we really are. The State needs to know what we are doing so that we can get credit for it. Vice President Myers echoed DelCorso's sentiments telling Moose Riders to "keep up the good work". DelCorso stressed the fact that, unless funds are channeled properly through the State, Moose Riders would not receive the recognition they deserve. Senior Class Essay Contest Awards at St. Charles Lodge









Right now (early March) I am in Montecello, Iowa, where I taught Yell and Tell at a school and will be doing a book signing at a custom car and rod show. We now have reached over 60,000 children in 26 states and 3 foreign countries. I was also in Vancouver, BC, teaching Yell and Tell and my daughter took it to Australia last Christmas. Last June I taught Yell and Tell in Hungary. We now have over 36 young children who have used Yell and Tell to save a life or prevent an injury from becoming worse. I am coming to Florida the week before Easter and there will be a ride for Yell and Tell on March 30th. The riders all over the country are wonderful about supporting Yell and Tell in their schools. It still only costs \$1.00 per child to get the program. If the Florida Riders can think of any way to have a fundraiser for Yell and Tell let me know for I



Three-Wheelin' - Cool and Comfortable



Riding is our passion. That's why we are Moose Riders. But some of us are getting up there in years, and maybe, just maybe, a little more comfort and stability wouldn't be such a bad thing.

We're young at heart and of mind, but the years are starting to take their toll on our bodies. But, hey, we don't want to give up the lifestyle of two wheels. So, what's the answer to an amazing riding experience that incorporates all those things? More and

more riders are finding all that and more on Trikes.

"Motorcycle industry experts say they expect to see more trikes on the road in the coming years as baby boomers, the largest group of motorcycle owners in the country, age out of their two wheelers". [http://www. huffingtonpost.com/2010/01/25/trikes-allow-aging-bikers_n_435118.html]

Imagine being able

to stop at a light or stop sign without worrying about your footing or balance—like I said, something we baby boomers are thinking more about these days. And if you are into touring or long trips, forget about saddlebags, you could have a trunk or drag along a trailer. Okay, you don't have to go out and buy matching outfits, nor should you feel like you are losing anything by going this route. Look around. You're seeing more and more trikes out there every day. Even Orange County Choppers built one for a vet this season.

There are many conversions available now—some of them simply awesome. Just about any make or model can be converted and the internet is chock full of shops ready to build you your dream machine. Many shops are even selling them new or you can always find a used one. And, if you think you're up to it, there are kits out there so you can do it yourself. If you want a production model, you could also look into the Can Am Spyder, a "reverse" trike. A hot looking machine with lots of power.

So, you think you might want to go this route. Good, but remember, riding a trike is a little bit different, but nothing a little time and practice won't cure. A lot of us started out on 3 wheels—you know what they say about riding a bike! Remember that ride? You didn't lean (that doesn't come into play on a trike). You turned the handlebars, or "pushed" them either to the right or the left—if you've ridden an ATV or have a riding mower, well . . you get the idea. The handlebars are quite responsive, so avoidsudden movements to the left or right. Also, the trike itself may feel a bit "heavy" or cumbersome at slower speeds, but once you get up to cruising, it's a whole different thing.

There are some tricks to riding a trike. Consider the following pointers if you decide to go three-wheelin'.

- Although the controls are the same as on a motorcycle, steering on a trike takes some getting used to.
- You might want to start out in a parking lot. Put your right hand in your back pocket and leave it there. With the Trike in 1st gear, drive around the lot maybe doing some figure 8s. You'll get a good feel for turning this way.
- Try the Push/Pull method of steering. For right turns, pull the right grip toward you while pushing with the left. Do the reverse for a left hand turn. It's a bit easier to pull on a hard turn than trying only to push.
- Train yourself to steer, not counter steer.
- Don't put your foot down when you stop remember you have a rear wheel and you might run over your foot.
- When pulling into parking places or even a gas or toll plaza, remember that you have a back end that is wider than the front.
- Take particular care on tight turns or on- or off-ramps. You'll need steady pressure in these turns. Again, practice and take your time

So, give it some thought. Trikes can be found in any size, shape or configuration. They can be new, used, or you can convert what you've got. In any event, it's still a good ride and with the right ride, you will definitely turn some heads.—Editor






