



Moose Riders Honor Lost Leader at State Convention

Mourning Officers Report Annual Fundraising of \$66,880.85



Florida Moose Rider officers were really looking forward to making presentations at the Annual convention in Tampa this year. What a year we had to talk about; what great plans we had for the future. We were on top of the world . . . until Thursday, October 21, when our world fell apart. The absolute worst had happened. Our state Chairman and dear friend went down on his bike when his rear tire blew on I-75 throwing him and his wife off.

The first news was sketchy, but soon we were all reassured that Margret was pretty much OK. The word about Mark was not so good, but no one wanted to believe it. News spread quickly (Moose Riders have a wonderful communication network) and many were either already at the hospital or, like us, dropped everything and left work to head for Tampa. Prayers were said and people waited anxiously. The hospital was overflowing with friends, family and Moose Riders, but the news was grim. Mark "Tiny" Metcalf was gone.

Mark believed in what Moose Riders did. He was proud of every cent we raised and every dollar we donated. He cared deeply about the children at Mooseheart and at the Youth Ranches. He loved visiting the seniors at Moosehaven and supporting their needs. But most of all he wanted to do a good job as Chairman.

In the weeks before the convention, Mark was anxious about his speech—fretting over what he would say and how he would say it in front of such a big crowd. He exchanged emails with his fellow officers collecting the financial information, and making sure he did this right. For those of you who never met him, especially those of you at the convention, you missed a real treat. It is cliché to say he was bigger than life, but he really was. His compassion and heart left a big impression on everyone whether he was chairing a meeting, speaking at a rally, or just partying alongside of you.

Moose Riders have big hearts too and believe in what they do. With this sad news, we all came together. Riders from districts near and far showed up for support and to comfort each other at the convention and to pay their respects.

Our Vice Chairman and now new Chairman, Gary Mundorf, rode up from Davie, FL, on Friday to join us and to work with Charlie to put something together to present at the convention on Saturday. It wasn't an easy task. It's difficult to mourn and carry on with business as usual, but it got done. As State Secretary, I made my presentation on Friday afternoon. Believe me when I tell you it was one of the most difficult things I have ever had to do.

Gary and Charlie took the stage on Saturday afternoon and reported that \$66,880.85 was raised by Moose Riders in one year under Mark's Chairmanship. Much of this money was donated to Mooseheart, some in the form of 14 laptop computers last May to the graduating class at Mooseheart. \$13,202.53 was donated to Florida Sheriffs Youth ranches and \$9,235.52 to Moosehaven. \$20,098.75 was raised and donated at the Lodge and District levels to various charities, families or individuals in need. Despite resounding applause, our great success at raising money was overshadowed by our sadness and grief. Fellow Moose and State dignitaries offered words of sympathy and much needed embraces following the presentations, helping those of us at the convention to make it through.

Mark had so many plans for Moose Riders. He had worked hard to mend fences and worked with Lodges and Moose Rider groups to understand how to work together. He wanted to let people everywhere know how hard Moose Riders work and how much they believe in what they do. Mark's credo was family first, job second, and Moose and Moose Riders third. He lived that way and led that way. We're all proud to have done so well for him this past year, but we owe a lot of our success to his spirit and motivation.

We will miss Mark "Tiny" Metcalf dearly, but we will continue our hard work under the leadership of our new Chairman, Gary Mundorf. We hope to once again step onto the stage next year and report even more money raised. We'll do it for the kids, we'll do it for the seniors and the families in need. But most of all, we'll do it for Tiny.—Ed.



International Introduces the Mark "Tiny" Metcalf Big Heart at Ride 4 Kids

First Ever International Award for Moose Riders



designated as "Moose Ride 4 Kids Day", a date that coincides with the 8th Annual Mooseheart Bike Blessing & Run motorcycle event, which is open to the public and originates at Mooseheart Child City & School in Illinois.

May 21, 2011 has been

"Out of the nearly 1700 Moose Lodge facilities in the U.S. and Canada, we have identified over ten percent of Lodges as

having 'Moose Rider' motorcycle activity groups," said Shawn Baile, Moose International's Director of Membership. "Our Moose Riders are very active in fund raising, membership development, and act as public ambassadors, helping to spread the word about our work at Mooseheart, as well as informing people about our senior retirement facility, Moosehaven, in Orange Park, Florida. They take the responsibility of caring for our children and seniors very seriously."

With "Moose Ride 4 Kids Days", Baile is putting out a call to all Moose Riders to take part in a coordinated fund raising effort to benefit the children of Mooseheart. The Mooseheart Bike Blessing & Run will remain the centerpiece event of the international effort.

"The concept is simple," said Baile. "For Moose Riders who cannot make the trip to Mooseheart for the annual Bike Blessing & Run, we are encouraging their local Moose Rider Activity Groups to host a motorcycle fund raising event of their own on May 21. They should invite both members and the motorcycle riding public, and collect pledges to benefit Mooseheart and another children's charity of their choice. The funds should then be split 50/50 between Mooseheart and the designated charity."

Additionally, by participating in "Moose Ride 4 Kids Day", Moose Rider groups will vie for the honor of being awarded the Mark "Tiny" Metcalf "Big Heart Award". The awards will go to the Lodge Moose Rider Group, District Moose Rider Group and State/Provincial Association Moose Rider Group delivering the highest dollar amount

designated for Mooseheart to Moose Charities by the end of May.

The award is named for Mark "Tiny" Metcalf, the late Florida/Bermuda Moose Association Moose Rider Chairman, who tragically lost his life during a mission on behalf of the Moose Riders whom he loved so much. It is the first award of its kind, specifically created to honor Moose Riders and their dedication to Mooseheart.

"In recognition of 'Tiny' Metcalf's extraordinary effectiveness in his short time as Moose Rider Chairman of the Florida/ Bermuda Moose Association, and in consideration of his willingness to bridge gaps and mend fences within the fraternity, and due to his commitment to our causes at Mooseheart and Moosehaven, the Membership Department of Moose International has instituted the Mark Metcalf memorial "Big Heart" Award in conjunction with the annual International Moose Ride 4 Kids Day," said Assistant Director of Membership and motorcyclist Chris Ecker. "As Mark was a great motivator and unifier through the Moose Rider program in life, so too we hope his spirit and his hopes for Moose Rider growth and recognition—and his big heart—will live on with "Moose Ride 4 Kids Day" and the Mark 'Tiny' Metcalf 'Big Heart' Award."

Each Moose Rider group participating will receive a frameable "Moose Ride 4 Kids Day" certificate. Moose Rider groups who make the pilgrimage to the annual Mooseheart event will also be able to qualify for the award by presenting a check for Moose Charities in person at the Bike Blessing.

"Moose Ride 4 Kids Day" will be a coordinated effort of Moose International's Membership Department and the offices of Moose Charities. Event resources, logo designs, pledge sheets, ride guides and other materials will be available on the Moose International website. —*Moose International*

Following the service, dignitaries, family, fellow Moose Riders, and friends gave their tributes. Particularly touching were the ones from the children, their pain and loss felt by everyone in the audience.

Later in the day as the sun was beginning to set, people gathered along with the family outside the Lodge for the presentation of a tree donated in Mark's name by District 4. A ceremonial ground breaking by District 4 Moose Riders and Mark's family was followed by the actual planting of the tree and initial Michelob Light "watering" of same. It is hoped that the tree will be an inspiration and will be a reminder of Mark and everything that he contributed to the Moose in his short lifetime.

It was a difficult weekend, but necessary for everyone. Our extended Moose Rider and Moose family came together, as we should, to support Mark's family and each other in a time of intense grief and loss. I would like to think we all left feeling a little bit closer to each other. I'm pretty sure that's what Mark would have wanted.—*Editor*




New Arizona Group Aids Local Charities

the Moose Riders to another segment of the motorcycle community.



Remember, if it's not recorded, we don't get credit for the event or the funds or the community service. Try to keep good records and fill out those reports. If you do a


local fundraiser, send Yvonne a copy of the check and let her know what it is for. If you do this your Lodge or District will get credit.


